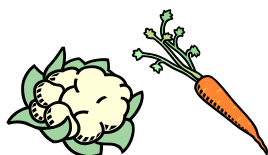

Exhibitor's 17 years and under

A Trophy named, **The Oxford A&P Association President's Trophy**, will be awarded to the exhibitor, 17yrs & under residing in the Oxford Show District (see boundary area in Conditions of Entry) who has gained the most points with their own individually named entries across the whole Show Schedule. The Trophy along with a Sash, will be presented annually by the Association's President, following Show Day.

RULES and REGULATIONS

The following Regulations of the Oxford A&P Association are incorporated with the by-laws for guidance of all persons at their Stock & Implement Exhibition.

NOTE: These are to be read in conjunction with other rules and conditions outlined in their respective

Sections, and the Rules of the Royal Agricultural Society of NZ (RAS) and their Affiliated Associations.



ENTRIES:

No late entries will be accepted
Entries close 28th February 2025.

No Entries will be considered unless Entry Form has been completed and signed. Online Entries must follow with payment and signed form, before they are actioned.

NO PASS to be granted for entry fees of less than: Adults \$10.

NO PASS issued to school age children. Entry on Show Day is Free is accompanied by an adult.

Entry in the Show entitles the Association to publish Exhibitors name in results, reports and distribute with Exhibitors List.

All Entries must be made with the Executive Officer and must be bona fide property of the Exhibitor - Stock: at time of entry.

- Produce and flowers: must have been grown by the Exhibitor.

- Art and Handwork exhibits: must be the work of the Exhibitor.

Exhibitors will be required to state as accurately as possible at the time of entry, Height Certificate, Flock or ID Numbers, Date of Birth of all stock in all Classes where age is specified; and in all classes of Sheep, the date of last shearing.

In all entries of livestock, the breeders name must be mentioned, if known the fact must be stated at the time of entry, for insertion in the Catalogue of entries. If omitted, the words 'breeder unknown' must be inserted. The owners of a Dam at the date of mating shall be considered the breeder.

BOUNDARY - District Classes: The boundaries of the Oxford Show District where competitors letterbox is

- West side from the Gary River heading south to the Bridge.
- North side heading west on Ashley Gorge Road to Rakahuri Road.
- West side along Rakahuri Road, across the Ashley River
- West side along Bowicks Road, Ashley Road, and Tippings Road to State Highway 72.
- North side heading west along State Highway 72 to Poyntz Road

- West side along Poyntz Road to the Waimakariri River.
- Along the north bank of the Waimakariri to Woodstock.
- The Dog Trials District boundaries shall be those as set out for the Oxford/Loburn Dog Trials District.
N.B.: Competitors to nominate only one District per Show season.

along State Highway No. 72 to Poyntz's Road and hence to the Waimakariri River and along the north bank of the Waimakariri to Woodstock.

The Dog Trials District boundaries shall be those as set out for the Oxford/Loburn Dog Trials District.

N.B.: Competitors to nominate only one District per Show season.

TRADE SPACE and CRAFT SITES

are available and may be booked by contacting the Executive Officer, no later than one month prior to Show.

FOOD SITES

are allocated by a Tender system. Tenders closed on 1st November 2024.

EXHIBITS:

All GP Hall Exhibits must be staged by 9am (including flowers and post entries).

Please check in the front of other Sections the relevant times, exhibits must be on grounds.

All exhibits not ready for judging at the call of the Class Steward will be liable to be disqualified.

No exhibit will be allowed on the ground if infested with external parasites or suffering from foot rot.

No exhibit shall be removed from the grounds until after 4pm on the day of the Show, without a special order from the President or Vice President.

Extra stock not eligible under any of the enumerated classes may be exhibited by paying the same entrance fee as is charged in similar classes.

The Committee or Show volunteer will not, under any circumstances, hold themselves responsible for loss, damage or miss-delivery of stock or implements exhibited at the Show.

ENTRY ON SHOW DAY:

Persons in charge of stock are admitted free on production of a pass and are subject to the order of the Stewards.

All persons admitted to the Show Grounds shall be subject to the rules and orders of the Committee, and admittance may be refused to any person who has not paid the entrance fee or who does not hold a pass admitting him/her.

PRIZES:

All Prizes not claimed within 7 days after the date of the Show, will be forfeited.

Where the exhibits are of sufficient merit, the Judge will indicate 1st, 2nd, 3rd, Very Highly Commended and Highly Commended, in order of merit. See Horse Section for Prize Money allocations, pertaining to Horse entries.

Points awarded are as follows:-

6 or more entries: 1st - 6 points; 2nd - 4 points; 3rd - 2 points; VHC - 1 point.

5 entries or less: 1st - 6 points; 2nd - 4 points; 3rd - 2 points; VHC - Nil.

Champion - 2 points extra;

Reserve Champion -1 point extra; Ties to count - one win each.

All Cups to be won individually. All cups to be competed for annually and to remain the property of the Association. **They are to be returned cleaned, no later than one month before Show Day.**

Unfortunately, due to Trophies/Cups/Trays not being returned from previous years and or sustaining damage over time, the Oxford A&P Association has had to introduce a policy and asks that all persons who wish to take a Trophy/Cup/Tray home, agrees to pay a bond of \$30 and sign the appropriate form.

RESERVATION OF RIGHT

The Oxford Show Committee reserves the right to alter or amend the programme as they see fit, cancel any class or event, divide, or combine any class and/or amend prize money, alter any advertised times, refuse any entry (with/without reason) and ask any unruly/dangerous animal to leave the grounds. The Oxford A&P Association is run by volunteers. Without their help, the running of this Show would not be possible.

PROTESTS

All protests must be in writing and lodged with the Executive Officer either before or after the Judges have proceeded to their duties. Any Exhibitor lodging a protest must deposit \$50 which will be forfeited if the protest/s be not sustained. If the protest be lodged before the Judges proceed with their duties, the onus of proof will rest with the Exhibitor. No protest will be accepted later than 1 hour after the prize-tickets are affixed or award presented. The Committee will decide all protests as soon as practicable, and there shall be no appeal from their decision.

Protest Committee members are - The President, and two Vice Presidents or their appointed delegates.

RAS IN-LINE RESOLUTION PROCESS POLICY

The full process can be found on the RAS website www.ras.org.nz. The principle behind the process is to deal with the matter as it comes to hand and in most cases it should be dealt with directly by the Show management.

AGRICULTURAL & PASTORAL SOCIETIES ACT 1908

Should any Exhibitor, in the opinion of the Committee, be guilty of any fraudulent or unfair practice, or any deceit or concealment, either in entering or exhibiting stock or any other exhibit, all exhibits of such an exhibitor shall be disqualified.

Should any Exhibitor infringe any of these Rules and Regulations, or refuse to comply with the direction of the Committee, the Committee shall have the power to suspend such a person as they may think fit.

Should any person or firm be disqualified or suspended by a kindred Association, The Committee of the Association shall have the power to endorse such disqualification or suspension and disqualify and suspend such person or firm accordingly.

TERMINATION OR CANCELLATION OF SHOW

1. Should an Exhibitor, Competitor or General Public be unable or unwilling to perform its part of these Terms or fail to comply with these Terms, or any of the Association's policies, or otherwise be in breach of these Terms, the Association may terminate these Terms by giving notice in writing. The Exhibitor, Competitor or General Public shall thereafter be prohibited from occupying its Site or attendance and shall immediately remove themselves, and their exhibits from the Showgrounds in accordance with the Associations directions.
2. The Association reserves the right in its sole discretion to cancel or to postpone the Show (and the operation of these Terms) by notice in writing. The Association shall not be liable to the Exhibitor or Competitor for any loss, damage, or compensation whatsoever arising out of the cancellation or postponement of the Show.
3. If the Show is abandoned or postponed due to any reason beyond the control of the Association, the Association is under no obligation to refund in whole or in part any payments made by the Exhibitors, Competitors and General Public. Any refund will be at the sole discretion of the Association.

Ownership - All horses and ponies entered in competitive classes or ring events or parading (whether by invitation or by entry) must be entered in the name of the bonifide owner. All animals must be named at time of entry.
Leases - A lease lodged with the Royal Agricultural Society must cover each leased horse or pony competing at any A&P Show. A Lease or Partnership must be recorded with the RAS on a recognised form to be acceptable. All benefits and penalties relating to a leased horse shall be attributed to the lessee. If the animal is registered with an affiliated breed society the lease must also be registered with that Society.

GRAND PARADE - 2.30pm

We welcome all competitors including placegetters to parade in this Royal Event spectacle of the Show - ride/lead with safety. Thank you for your support with this. Three spot prizes of \$50 will be presented.

BACK NUMBERS

Breastplate holders are compulsory (except for Working Hunter, Hunter Jumping and Stock & Station sections).
No back number will be issued to rider/handler/horse/pony in any flat classes. Working Hunter, Hunter Jumping and Stock & Station sections Back Numbers will be available from the Equestrian Office at the north-east end of the arena on Show Day only.

IN-LINE RESOLUTION PROCESS POLICY

This Show supports the In-Line Resolution Process Policy. A 'Yellow or Red Card' which will be offered for any inappropriate behaviour towards Show Officials, Judges, Fellow Competitors or any other third party connected with the Show bringing the Equestrian discipline into disrepute, or cases

which are of a less serious nature to the above in accordance with the conduct of Members, Owners, Lessees, Competitors and/or Exhibitors, as provided in the RAS Equestrian Competitors and Judges Rulebook and RAS Constitution.

CONDITIONS

The following condition to be read in conjunction with Rules & Regulations in front of Catalogue, as well as the Royal A&P Society Rules and Regulations.

Where exhibits are entered to compete in more than one Section, they must be available when called - no compensation will be given for classes missed.

AGES

Riders - Riders/Handlers are taken as at 1 August 2024 - refer to RAS Equestrian Rulebook, Rule CDE 11, for all Age of Riders/Handlers Rules.

Proof of age to be carried and produced on request of Ring Steward/Judge.

Horses/Ponies - Horses/Ponies 3 years and under must not be ridden.

HATS & SAFETY HELMETS

a) In all cases current WorkSafe New Zealand rules prevail.

b) All riders, including harness drivers/with the exclusion of heavy horse (Clydesdale) working classes, competing at RAS affiliated A&P Shows/Events must wear protective headgear, which includes a retaining harness secured to the shell at more than two points. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap properly adjusted and fastened when in the arena or ring, the practice area, collecting rings or anywhere else within a Showgrounds or the grounds of an affiliated Event.

c) Hats/helmets must conform with one of the current approved safety standards. These standards may be subject to change but the latest list can be found at <http://www.ras.org.nz> – equestrian. RAS will advise any changes via their website and Facebook.

d) All hats/helmets that conform as per c) must be identified by the current 'YELLOW' tag system implemented by NZPCA, ESNZ and RAS. <https://www.ras.org.nz/equestrian/health-and-safety/>

CLEAN SPORT

The Rules of the Royal A&P Society New Zealand in regard to Clean Sport apply. Competitors are advised that testing for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show and that testing of all animals is at the person responsible's risk.

Forbidden Substance - Any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardio-vascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, musculoskeletal or urogenital systems.

MEASURING - RAS CERTIFICATES

RAS Certificates (Life, Annual, Horse/Pony ID Form) accepted.

RAS Certificate Number to be stated at time of entry.

RAS Certificates must be carried at all times and produced on request. Competitors failing to produce their certificate when requested by the Steward will not be allowed in the ring, or will be asked to leave the ring - any Awards will be forfeited.

Temporary Measuring Certificate

Measuring of Temporary Measuring Certificates will be carried out between 3pm and 4pm on Friday 28 March 2025 only - NO measuring will be undertaken on Show Day.

Please contact the Equestrian Convenor if you are wanting a TMC - M: 027 421 0394.

RAS Temporary Measuring Certificate @ \$20.00 each will only be issued to Competitors/Exhibitors who live in the defined Oxford Show boundary.

TMC Rules - ras.org.nz / Equestrian section / Rulebook page / Measuring -Appendix A.

Normal shoes may be fitted. In such a case 0.5cm allowance only shall be made. No allowance shall be made for thin shoes or racing plates.

RAS Temporary Measuring Certificates must be carried and produced as requested.

HORSE ABUSE

a) Any complaints of exhibit abuse, will be dealt through the RAS In-Line Resolution Process – view on www.ras.org.nz

b) Abuse can be defined as intentionally acting in a way, which may cause pain or unnecessary discomfort to a horse. As examples, but not limited to;

- i. Whip or beat an exhibit excessively
- ii. Subject an exhibit to any kind of electric shock device
- iii. Excessive or persistent use of spurs, or to jab the exhibit in the mouth with the bit.
- iv. Remount, or attempt to remount, an obviously exhausted, lame or injured exhibit
- v. 'Rap' an exhibit anywhere in or outside the grounds of the event
- vi. Hyper sensitise any part of an exhibit
- vii. Leave exhibit without adequate food, drink and exercise.

WHISKER and INNER EAR TRIMMING

The Royal Agricultural Society (RAS) has teamed with Equestrian Sports New Zealand (ESNZ) and

NZ Pony Club (and the FEI from 2021) and banned the trimming of whiskers, eye and inner ear hair for horses and ponies competing at affiliated A&P Shows and Kindred Events from the 1 January 2022.

RAS rules state GR6 Abuse of Exhibits b) Abuse can be defined as intentionally acting in a way, which may cause pain or unnecessary discomfort to a horse.

NOVICE SECTION CONDITIONS:

A novice horse or pony or rider is one that has yet to win six classes in any division within the competitions provided at any A&P Show. Divisions may be Leading Rein, First Ridden, Pony Hacks, Pony Hunters on the Flat, Pony Round the Ring Jumpers, Cobs, Park Hacks, Hacks, Riding Horse, Saddle (Flat) Hunters, Paced and Manners Classes in each of the preceding divisions, Round the Ring Jumping (ponies and horses) Rider Classes.

Once a horse or pony has had 6 wins in conformation classes, it is not eligible to compete in further Novice classes.

Once a horse or pony has had 6 wins in paced and mannered classes, it is not eligible to compete in further Novice paced and mannered classes.

Novices may enter Open Classes.

Hacks: Any Lady's Hack or Gentleman's Hack class win counts as an Open Conformation Class.

Novice Champions are not eligible for Open Championships unless they have won their Open Class, nor are they eligible for Supreme Award. Championship Award does not count as a win.

Novice horses or ponies entered in Novice Classes must be shown in Snaffle Bits only (excepting Harness Classes)

If a novice entry has gained 6 or more wins at the day of the show, the Competitor must advise the Secretary's Office and may change to an Open Class, or if no class remains to enter, a refund will be actioned at such time as the Show Committee decides.

PONY BREEDERS SOCIETY OF NZ

Open to ponies fully registered with Pony Breeders Society of NZ and be foaled in NZ.

Judged on 60% conformation / 40% Paces and Manners.

Registration number to be stated on entry form. Registration certificate to be produced if required - the winner of the sash MUST be able to show the ring steward their registration certificate before receiving the sash.

If it is subsequently found that the winner of a Pony Breeders Society Sash is not registered with the Society, they will be required to forfeit this award. Pony must be ridden by a rider under the age of 17yrs.

NZ RIDING PONY SOCIETY

Open to ponies fully registered with NZ Riding Pony Society.

Judged on 80% conformation / 20% Paces and Manners.

Ridden Class for saddle ponies up to 148cm and judged on quality and conformation. Registration number to be stated on entry form. Registration certificate to be produced if required - the winner of the sash MUST be able to show the ring steward their registration certificate before receiving the sash.

If it is subsequently found that the winner of a NZ Riding Pony Society Sash is not registered with the Society, they will be required to forfeit this award.

STALLIONS / COLTS:

All stallions and colts (with the exception of Foals, Miniature Horses and Shetland Pony Yearlings must be shown in a bit.

A Steward will order any stallion/colt considered out of control or to be causing undue disquiet to other horses from the ring without recourse from the stallion/colt's owner/exhibitor/competitor.

It is compulsory for all stallions and colts, except foals, to wear two (2) official 'S' identification badges, one attached to each side of their bridle, at all Shows/Events at all times. The rider/handler must also wear two RAS official (2) armbands (one on each arm) when in the ring. 'S' badges to be purchased from RAS Head Office or ESNZ; armbands from RAS Head Office.

Handlers and Riders of stallions/colts must wear an approved Hi Viz vest at Shows/Events when outside the showing ring. Vests can be purchased from RAS Head Office.

HACK/HUNTER DRY MARE CLASSES

If entered in Section 1, 2, 3 or 4, dry mare is not eligible for section 13 classes.

SUBSTITUTIONS

A Vet Certificate must be produced to the Secretary for any horse or pony wishing to be substituted with another animal. The substitution is required to meet qualifications as stipulated in accordance with the Rules.

The Association must be notified at the time of entry of any testing to be carried out after the closing date of entries or of any potential TB issues that may arise after entries have been submitted. Owners entering cattle must sign any declaration printed on the entry form.

There are two documents required.

1. First document is a TB Test Certificate. For animals from a Declared Movement Control Area – all animals aged three months or older are to be TB tested and have a clear test within 60 days prior to being moved to the Show. All other animals must be from a herd that is up to date with it's current routine TB testing requirements.

2. Second document is a TB Animal Status Declaration Card. This is a legal requirement for all animals being moved. All animals entered must be accompanied in transit by a signed and dated TB Animal Status Declaration Card showing a TB Clear status in accordance with present legislation. Animal individual numbers must be included on the TB test sheet. These cards may be inspected at the unloading area.

- For cattle being moved from 1 July 2012: A NAIT approved RFID tag will be mandatory for all movements of cattle, including day old calves. NAIT approved RFID cattle tags are white only. Please do not remove tags if cattle are identified with Animal Health Board or MINDA tags.
- As of 1 July 2012 a secondary tag is no longer required under the new NAIT scheme.
- All animals being exhibited at the Show including any participating in a hoof and hooks carcass competition come under the standard identification and ASD regulations. These cattle will require the NAIT approved RFID tag.
- Where live cattle or deer form part of a trade display the exhibitor is responsible for:

(i) Ensuring all stock have completed all TB testing requirements as per Animal Health Board testing regulations.

(ii) Ensuring all stock are identified in accordance with current legal requirements.

1 tsp baking powder

75g ground almonds

2 tsp mixed spice

100g glacé cherries

50g mixed peel (candied lemon and orange peel)

Method

Pop the sultanas and apricots into a bowl and pour over the citrus zest and juice. Leave this to soak for at least two hours, or ideally overnight if you have the time.

Heat the oven to 160C/140C fan/gas mark 3, and butter/grease a 900g loaf tin and line the base and sides with baking paper, leaving about 2cm overhanging.

Pop the butter, sugar, eggs, flour, baking powder, ground almonds and mixed spice in a large mixing bowl with a pinch of salt, and whisk to combine until smooth and creamy, this should take you around a minute (and will be a good workout for your arms!).

Add the soaked fruit and any juice to the cake batter along with the cherries and mixed peel. Fold everything together using a spatula until the fruit is evenly distributed.

Scrape your mixture into the tin and level the surface for an even bake. Bake on the middle shelf of the oven for 1 hr 30 mins, checking it after 1 hr 15 mins – if it's getting too dark on top, cover with foil but mind your fingers don't get burnt.

The cake is ready when a skewer inserted into the middle comes out clean. If any wet batter clings to the skewer, return the cake to the oven for 5 mins more and check again.

When the cake is done, put the tin on a wire rack and leave to cool completely. Remove the cake from the tin and if you're planning on decorating the cake, you can do this now.

One of the great things about fruit cake is that it will keep in an airtight container for up to two weeks or in the freezer for up to six months.

Ice with the following

2 tbsp apricot jam

250g marzipan

icing sugar, for dusting

250g ready-rolled white fondant icing

Method

Warm the apricot jam in a pan over a low heat to loosen the jam and brush this over the cake with a pastry brush.

Roll the marzipan out on a surface lightly dusted with icing sugar until it's large enough to fit the top of the cake (use the tin to measure to make it easier). Then press the marzipan onto the top of the cake, but not with too much pressure - you don't want to squish the cake!

Repeat this process with the fondant icing, pressing it onto the marzipan. Trim the edges of the fondant and marzipan to make a neat rectangle.

Use mini shape cutters to stamp out shapes from the fondant topping if you want to make the cake a bit more of a centre piece, or leave as is. Just be

careful not to cut through to the marzipan underneath
